

<b><u>3 Problem ID Questions</u></b>	+	<b><u>5 PASRR Steps</u></b>
NO problems		<b><u>Prevent problems</u></b> from starting or worsening <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Foundation-Building Toolset (parenting styles)</li> <li>• Self-Esteem Toolset</li> <li>• Cooperation Toolset</li> <li>• Independence Toolset</li> </ul>
<b>When Problems Arise</b> Look at the smaller problem “parts” and identify the problem type for each part.		
<b>QUESTION #1:</b> Is this a Child problem (C) or a Parent problem (P)? (Narrow it down.)		
Child problems - involve “PESS” Peers, Emotions, Siblings, School	<b>SAY</b>	<b><u>Acknowledge the child’s feelings</u></b> (If <i>only</i> a Child problem, stop at this step: Child Problem Toolbox.)
Parent problems - involve “SHARP RV” Safety, Health, Appropriateness, Rights, Property, Rules, Values		<b><u>Set limits or express concerns.</u></b> (If no misbehavior, stop at this step: Keep Your Cool, Clear Communication Toolsets.)
<b>When There is Misbehavior</b>		
<b>QUESTION #2:</b> Is the misbehavior in this Parent problem Unintentional (PU) or “On purpose” (PO)? <b>Yes or No:</b> Has <i>this child consistently shown</i> that he or she has <i>mastered</i> the skills to behave properly in this situation? (Narrow it down.)		
<b>PU problem = No.</b> Child has <i>not</i> mastered skills due to: immaturity, personality, accident, medical condition or lack of information	<b>DO</b>	<b><u>Redirect the misbehavior</u></b> (PU or PO Toolset) <b>PU</b> = Teach skills or offer acceptable alternative
<b>PO problem = Yes.</b> Child <i>has</i> mastered skills and misbehavior is deliberate.  <b>QUESTION #3:</b> If the behavior is “On purpose” (PO), what is the purpose? Attention, Power, Revenge, Giving up		<b>PO</b> = Avoid payoff/escalating and show child how to meet purpose through positive behavior
For <i>either</i> PU or PO...	<b>FOLLOW THROUGH</b>	<b><u>Reveal discipline</u></b> Must meet the “4 R’s”
<b>Combination types:</b> Identify the problem type for each part. <b>Address the Child problem first.</b> <b>C/P</b> = Part Child problem <i>and</i> part Parent problem involving no misbehavior. <b>C/PU</b> = Part Child problem <i>and</i> part Parent problem involving Unintentional misbehavior. <b>C/PO</b> = Part Child problem <i>and</i> part Parent problem involving “On purpose” misbehavior.		
<b>Maintain Progress</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Family Council Toolset — when problems/decisions affect the whole family.</li> <li>• Three C's: Consistency, Criticism, Confidence</li> </ul>
